

Church Hours/Adoration

The church will be open for private prayer, Monday through Friday from 8:00am-5:00pm. From 8:00-9:00am, the only entrance will be through the door on the main parking lot side. If for some reason the main door is not unlocked, please enter through the parking lot door, as this entrance will always be open from 8:00am-5:00pm, Monday through Friday. Saturday, the church will be open from 8:00am-4:30pm using only the parking lot door. The front and carport doors will be unlocked at 4:15pm for those attending Mass. All doors of the church will be unlocked on Sunday morning at 8:00am for those attending Mass. Adoration will take place on Tuesday from 1:00pm-6:00pm, with Benediction but no evening prayer.

Liturgical Reflection ~ 2nd Sunday of Easter

FIRST READING: Acts 2:42-47

Throughout Easter Time, our First Reading is taken from the Acts of the Apostles, leading us to reflect upon the story of the first Christians and the community of believers. Their brief passage we hear today provides a glimpse into the life of the early Christian community, a vision statement of the ideal community in which God is praised and the people are in communion with one another.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: Psalm 118

Through the proclamation of Psalm 118, we are called together to sing the praise of God whose "mercy endures forever". The psalmist acknowledges that we may falter and fall at times, yet the Lord is our strength. Particularly in Easter Time, our song of praise is appropriate. The rejected stone has become the cornerstone. "This is the day the Lord has made: let us be glad and rejoice in it."

SECOND READING: 1 Peter 1:3-9

This reading begins with a great proclamation of praise, summarizing the reason for our rejoicing, namely the Resurrection of Jesus Christ which opens the doors to salvation for those who are "safeguarded through faith" by the power of God. While we may have to suffer through various trials, we are encouraged to remain steadfast in faith, ensuring that we will attain the goal of faith; salvation in Christ.

GOSPEL: John 20:19-31

Our reflection on this passage often focuses on Thomas, whom we label "doubting". So much so, we may miss the other aspects of the story: Jesus' proclamation of peace, the disciples being sent, the gift of the Holy Spirit, the life that is offered through belief in Christ. The familiar story of the disciples' encounter with the Risen Christ encourages our focus on faith, even when we experience doubt, and the impact of this faith in our lives: peace, mission, and new life.



About this Sunday

The Sunday of Divine Mercy is a day established by Pope John Paul II as a perennial invitation to the Christian world to face with confidence, in divine benevolence, the difficulties and trials that humankind will experience in the years to come. This is not a new solemnity of feast, nor does it celebrate a new or separate mystery of redemption, but rather, it leads into the continuing celebration of God's mercy during Easter time. As the Octave Day of Easter, the readings and prayer texts highlight the mystery of divine compassion that underlies the Church's Easter faith.

Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor


It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement.

It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-HourChild Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis. To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator Mary Beth Pacuska at 570-862-7551.




DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

On **Sunday, April 16**th, we will celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday from 3:00pm – 4:00pm in the church with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, praying the Divine Mercy Chaplet, confessions, and Benediction. All members of the parish are invited and encouraged to participate in this special devotion.



Divine Mercy Sunday is celebrated on the Second Sunday of Easter. It is based on the private revelations of St. Faustina Kowalska, which recommended a particular devotion to the Divine Mercy. In 2000, Pope John Paul II canonized St. Faustina and, during the ceremony, he declared: "It is important then that we accept the whole message that comes to us from the word of God on this Second Sunday of Easter, which from now on throughout the Church will be called Divine Mercy Sunday." This is not a new solemnity of feast, nor does it celebrate a new or separate mystery of redemption, but rather, it leads into the continuing celebration of God's mercy during Easter time and is not based solely on St. Faustina's revelations. Indeed, it is not primarily about St. Faustina - nor is it altogether a new feast. The Second Sunday of Easter was already a solemnity as the Octave Day of Easter. The title "Divine Mercy Sunday" does, however

highlight the meaning of the day.



Bishop James C. Timlin 1928-2023

The Most Reverend James C. Timlin, D.D., eighth Bishop of Scranton, died on Easter Sunday morning, April 9, 2023, in Scranton. He was 95.

In response to the passing of Bishop Timlin, the Most Reverend Joseph C. Bambera, Bishop of Scranton, said the following: "On behalf of the priests, deacons, religious and laity of the Diocese of Scranton, I extend my sympathy, condolences and prayers to Bishop Timlin's family and friends. Bishop Timlin was a prayerful man devoted to serving the faithful of northeastern and north central Pennsylvania as a priest and bishop for more than 70 years. May God grant Bishop Timlin the gift of eternal life and give consolation to all those who loved and respected him."
