Church Hours/Adoration

The church will be open for private prayer, Monday through Friday from 8:00am-5:00pm. From 8:00-9:00am, the only entrance will be through the door on the main parking lot side. From 9:00am-5:00pm, the front door and carport entrance will be open. If for some reason the main door is not unlocked, please enter through the parking lot door, as this entrance will always be open from 8:00am-5:00pm, Monday through Friday. Saturday, the church will be open from 8:00am-4:30pm using only the parking lot door. The front and carport doors will be unlocked at 4:15pm for those attending Mass. All doors of the church will be unlocked on Sunday morning at 8:00am for those attending Mass. Adoration will take place on Tuesday from 1:00pm-6:00pm, with Benediction but no evening prayer.

Liturgical Reflection ~ 3rd Sunday of Easter

FIRST READING: Acts 2:14, 22-33

After the descent of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, Peter speaks to all who are in Jerusalem, particularly the Jewish people who were there for the feast. He tells them that Jesus was commended to them by God, yet he was crucified and died. God raised him up, as foretold by David. Quoting psalm 16, he explains that David foretold the Resurrection; while David died, Jesus died yet was raised. Exalted at the right hand of God, Christ received the promise of the Holy Spirit from the Father.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: Psalm 16

As we proclaim the psalm today, we will recall Peter's use of this psalm in his discourse. On this Sunday in Easter we take refuge in God, blessing the Lord who is always with us. We rejoice that through Christ, we will not be abandoned to the netherworld; at his right hand, we will abound in joy.

SECOND READING: 1 Peter 1:17-21

Those who commit themselves to living faith are to conduct themselves with reverence, recognizing and responding to the sacrificial and saving act of Christ, the unblemished lamb. This same Christ was known before the foundation of the world, and was revealed to those who through him, believe in God. As those who have been saved by the blood of the spotless lamb, we are exhorted to find our faith and hope in God through Christ.

GOSPEL: Luke 24:13-35

The encounter of the disciples on the road with Jesus, whom they do not recognize, is Likely a familiar story. Yet the narrative rings true for us, as it would have for its first hearers. Jesus reassures the disciples, explains the Scriptures they would have known since childhood, and joins them for supper, only to be made known to them in the breaking of the bread. This Easter narrative gives witness to the Resurrection and the enduring presence of Christ in the Eucharist.

Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor

It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement.


It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-HourChild Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at <u>www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis</u>. To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual wellbeing. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator Mary Beth Pacuska at 570-862-7551.
