

Church Hours/Adoration

The church will be open for private prayer, Monday through Friday from 8:00am-5:00pm. From 8:00-9:00am, the only entrance will be through the door on the main parking lot side. From 9:00am-5:00pm, the front door and carport entrance will be open. If for some reason the main door is not unlocked, please enter through the parking lot door, as this entrance will always be open from 8:00am-5:00pm, Monday through Friday. Saturday, the church will be open from 8:00am-4:30pm using only the parking lot door. The front and carport doors will be unlocked at 4:15pm for those attending Mass. All doors of the church will be unlocked on Sunday morning at 8:00am for those attending Mass. Adoration will take place on Tuesday from 1:00pm-6:00pm, with Benediction but no evening prayer.

Liturgical Reflection ~ 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time

FIRST READING: Isaiah 22:19-23


The First Reading describes the transferal of authority as Shebna is removed from his high post, master of the palace, and a new leader, Eliakim, is put in his place and invested with all his power. God is the giver of authority. According to the Second Book of Kings (22:8), Eliakim's father Hilkiah had brought honor to his family by finding a copy of the book of the Law that was the impetus for reforms instituted by King Josiah. Now Eliakim has the opportunity to bring further honor by acting as a wise father, a careful guardian, and a living symbol of stability.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: Psalm 138

In Psalm 138, we ask God to be involved in our lives, to stay with his creation and continue to bless "the work of your hands." The psalm is a hymn of thanksgiving for the many ways in which the Lord has blessed the psalmist.

SECOND READING: Romans 11:33-36

This wonderful meditation on the mystery of God concludes the sequence of reading we have heard about the Jewish people. Faced with the reality that most of his Jewish kindred have not accepted Jesus, Paul utilizes his own experience and education in creating a solution to this painful situation. After all his complicated explanations, Paul seemed to realize that his arguments couldn't answer all his questions; the mystery of God's saving plan is beyond human comprehension. We can only wonder and trust in the wisdom of God. Having exhausted his capacity to provide a cogent explanation to the Jewish people about God's plan of salvation, Paul shifts to give praise and glory to God. Ultimately, it is not a logical explanation of the great mysteries, but lived participation in them, enhanced by prayer, that is most important for Paul and for all who believe in Jesus.



GOSPEL: Matthew 16:13-20

Who is Jesus? Answers to this question are woven throughout the Gospel accounts, inspiring all who hear the story to answer questions for themselves. When Jesus asks his disciples how they would answer the question, Simon Peter speaks for the group – Jesus is the Christ, the long awaited Messiah. Jesus praises Peter, calling him blessed and the recipient of God's revelation. In the First Reading God chose Eliakim as a leader for his people. Here, Jesus chooses Peter. Peter is chosen not because of his

leadership potential - just two Sunday's ago our reading showed us a Peter who boldly stepped out onto the sea but whose confidence quickly faded at the sight of the waves. Rather, Peter is chosen because he has learned to listen to the voice of God – for it is through God that Peter is able to recognize Jesus as the Christ. Peter is called the "rock", but the strength of the Church built upon him does not come from Peter, but rather from God.

Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor

It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement.


It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-HourChild Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis. To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator Mary Beth Pacuska at 570-862-7551.

SCHEDULING 2024 MASS INTENTIONS

Scheduling Mass intentions for 2024 will be available beginning September 5th through the parish office, during regular business hours. **The following are the established guidelines for scheduling intentions:**

One weekend Mass on each weekend must be celebrated for the intentions of the parish. This is required by Canon Law (c. 534). Because of this, we only have one weekend Mass for which we can accept an intention. Due to this limited availability of weekend Masses, no family may schedule more than ONE WEEKEND MASS PER QUARTER, or four weekend Masses per year. There is no limit to the number of daily Mass intentions which may be scheduled by each family.

Canon 948 states, "Separate Masses are to be applied for the intentions of those for whom a single offering, although small, has been given and accepted." Therefore, only one intention may be scheduled for any given Mass. However, for pastoral concerns to better accommodate the needs of the parishioners, we will adhere to the following: Up to three first names with the same last name (i.e., John, Paul, and Mary Smith) or two last names only (i.e., Scott and Smith Families) will be allowed per intention.

The stipend given for a Mass intention is \$10. While we are willing to take requests over the phone, your Mass intention will not be scheduled until we are in receipt of your donation.

Christmas, Easter, Mother's Day, Father's Day, and All Souls Day Masses are always for the individual intentions listed by parishioners on their envelope.

The Sanctuary Candle, burning in memory or in honor of someone, is available on a weekly basis with no limit to the number each family may reserve. The stipend given for the Sanctuary Candle is \$10.
