Church Hours/Adoration

The church will be open for private prayer, Monday through Friday from 8:00am-5:00pm. From 8:00-9:00am, the only entrance will be through the door on the main parking lot side. From 9:00am-5:00pm, the front door and carport entrance will be open. Saturday, the church will be open from 8:00am-4:30pm using only the parking lot door. The front and carport doors will be unlocked at 4:15pm for those attending Mass. Liturgical Reflection ~ Third Sunday of Advent

FIRST READING: Isaiah 35:1-6,10

Today's First Reading is one of the hopeful visions. There is much joy and anticipation as we await rare desert flowers and miraculous curses. God restores all that has become barren to former beauty, and those who have been taken captive in Babylon will be freed and will enter Zion (Jerusalem) singing. What encouragement for the feeble and the frightened, to hear they will be made whole again!

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: Psalm 146

Psalm 146 is a song of praise, giving thanks to God for all that he has done. The response is fashioned from Isaiah 35:4, reiterating the notion that our God will come and save us. The tense of the psalm reminds us that this is not a concept from of old, but a reality for today. Psalm 146 is the joyful prayer of one who has lived through terrible times, only to shine forth praising God's name. Faith and trust are learned amidst pain and suffering.

SECOND READING: James 5:7-10

Patience is a difficult virtue to learn and act upon. None of us wants to hear "in God's time". We want what we want now. Yet, in his wisdom, James counsels that we must wait patiently and joyously, and to never give up. Temptation and rash judgments are things which can get us into trouble when we do not think things through and spontaneously act upon our desires. We must be patient.

GOSPEL: Matthew 11:2-11

Last Sunday's reading from Matthew introduced John the Baptist's call to repent in order to prepare for the arrival of God's final rule, which he described as "the coming wrath". He indicated awareness that he himself was not the Messiah, but his forerunner. It is ironic that as we speak of waiting, John the Baptist becomes impatient and sends his disciples to inquire, "are you [Jesus] the one who is to come or should we look for another?" He seems disappointed that there is not a big, fiery finish. Jesus rebukes him and, paraphrasing Isaiah says that the prophecies have now been fulfilled. However, realizing he responded quickly, Jesus goes on to tell the crowds the great things that John has done.

GAUDETE SUNDAY

"Rejoice: the Lord is nigh." As Christmas draws near, the Church emphasizes the joy which should be in our hearts over all that the birth of our Savior means for us. The great joy of Christians is to see the day drawing nigh when the Lord will come again in His glory to



lead them into His kingdom. The oft-repeated Veni ("Come") of Advent is an echo not only of the prophets but also of the conclusion of the Apocalypse of St. John: "Come, Lord Jesus," the last words of the New Testament. Today is known as Gaudete Sunday. The term Gaudete refers to the first word of the Entrance Antiphon, "Rejoice". Like Lent, Advent is a penitential season, so the priest normally wears purple vestments. But on Gaudete Sunday, having passed the midpoint of Advent, the Church lightens the mood a little, and the priest may wear rose vestments. The change in color provides us with encouragement to continue our spiritual preparation— especially prayer and fasting—for Christmas. For this same reason, the third candle of the Advent wreath, first lit on Gaudete Sunday, is traditionally rose-colored. Gaudete Sunday has a counterpart in Lent: Laetare Sunday. God is at work turning sorrow to joy!








