Liturgical Reflection – Third Sunday of Advent: Gaudete Sunday



GOSPEL: John 1:6-8, 19-28

John the Baptist calls people to conversion in order to prepare them for the coming of the Messiah by proclaiming a time of repentance. Through this account, John tries to help his audience understand who Jesus is. Jesus is "the light". We hear this in the opening of today's reading as John clarifies that the Baptist was "not the light, but came to testify to the light." The ministry of John the Baptist was to "baptize" the people in preparation for the coming of the Messiah; to prepare the way of the Lord, making straight the path through a conversion of hearts to justice and righteousness.

Gaudete Sunday

"Rejoice: The Lord is nigh." As Christmas draws near, the Church emphasizes the joy which should be in our hearts over all that the birth of our Savior means for us. The great joy of Christians is to see the day drawing nigh when the Lord will come again in His glory to lead



them into His kingdom. The oft-repeated Veni ("Come") of Advent is an echo not only of the prophets, but also of the conclusion of the Apocalypse of St. John: "Come, Lord Jesus," the last words of the New Testament. Today is known as Gaudete Sunday. The term Gaudete refers to the first word of the Entrance Antiphon, "Rejoice". Like Lent, Advent is a penitential season, so the priest normally wears purple vestments. But on Gaudete Sunday, having passed the midpoint of Advent, the Church lightens the mood a little, and the priest may wear rose vestments. The change in color provides us with encouragement to continue our spiritual preparation – especially prayer and fasting – for Christmas. For this same reason, the third candle of the Advent wreath, first lit on Gaudete Sunday, is traditionally rose colored. Gaudete Sunday has a counterpart in Lent: Laetare Sunday. God is at work turning sorrow to joy!

Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor

It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement.

It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-HourChild Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at <u>www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis</u>. To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator Mary Beth Pacuska at 570-862-7551.




<u>Beautiful Eucharist</u>






CHRISTLIFE"

If you can't join us for Mass and Adoration, the Epiphany Celebration will begin around 11am. We will start upstairs and proceed downstairs to the manger. Please join us!


