



# Liturgical Reflection – 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time

**GOSPEL: Mark 1:21-28** 



Jesus enters the synagogue and teaches with an authority different from that of the scribes. He exorcises an unclean spirit from a man possessed. The unclean spirit knew the truth about Jesus: "What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are — the Holy One of God." Those who witnessed the exorcism were filled with awe, a reaction to seeing something so wondrous that one cannot understand it. They do not yet know who Jesus it, but they already know that something very holy is happening in their midst.

# Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor

It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement. It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-HourChild Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis . To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator Mary Beth Pacuska at 570-862-7551.



#### The Presentation of the Lord

The Feast of the Presentation of the Lord celebrates the presentation of Christ in the temple at Jerusalem on the 40<sup>th</sup> day after his birth. When Christ was presented in the temple, Simeon embraced the Child and prayed the Canticle of Simeon: "Now thou dost dismiss thy servant, O Lord, according to thy word in peace; because my eyes have seen thy Salvation, which thou hast prepared before the face of all peoples: a light To the revelation of the Gentiles, and the glory of thy people Israel" (Luke 2:29-32). Inspired by the words of the canticle, the custom of blessing candles on the Feast of the Presentation developed in the west. Because of this, the feast also became known as *Candlemas*.



Candles will be blessed during the 12:10pm Mass on Friday, February 2<sup>nd</sup>.

Before Mass begins, parishioners should place any candles they would like to have blessed on the table in front of the altar.


