Church Hours/Adoration

Liturgical Reflection ~ 13th Sunday in Ordinary Time

FIRST READING: 2 Kings 4:8-11, 14-16

Prophets are more often running for their lives than receiving a warm welcome, but this reading from 2 Kings gives us an example of the latter situation. A widow in Shunem welcomes Elisha warmly and even provides him with his own room, so that he can feel at home whenever he visits. Her hospitality is rewarded: the prophet tells her that she will soon have the son she has long wished for. Typically in biblical annunciations of an extraordinary birth, it is the child to be born who is the focus of attention. Here, in contrast, the woman and the prophet Elisha are the center. The episode is part of the saga in which Elisha is depicted as a prophet powerful in work and deed, a worthy heir to Elijah. The Shunemite woman illustrates how one is to receive both prophet and the prophetic word: with openness and eager welcome.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: Psalm 89

Psalm 89 is the song of people who know and rejoice in the faithfulness of God. The psalm, which speaks of God's praise echoing through the generations, is a joyful response to the good news at the end of the First Reading – the birth of a child.

SECOND READING: Romans 6:3-4, 8-11

We continue our reading of St. Paul's letter to the Romans with a key passage about Baptism, which is also read at the great Easter Vigil. Baptism is nothing less than death and life. Through Baptism, we die with Christ, and share in the power of his Resurrection from the dead. We are not the same anymore: and we need to live like the new, redeemed people that we are. As Paul continues to exhort the community in the verses that follow today's reading, he provided specifics on how they are to live, having been brought from death to new life through the grace of Baptism.

GOSPEL: Matthew 10:37-42

Jesus warns his Apostles of what to expect before he sends them out to proclaim the Gospel. This will be no easy task and it requires a commitment beyond anything else in their lives, a bond even stronger than that between parent and child. And yet, the rewards are beyond measure, not only for the Apostles, but for all who help them: "whoever receives a prophet because he is a prophet will receive a prophet's reward," Jesus says, alluding to today's First Reading. The woman who welcomed Elisha out of love of God was rewarded beyond her imagining. When we welcome others in the name of Christ, we welcome Christ himself. Jesus' disciples, like Jesus himself, are numbered among the prophets and righteous persons. In addition, disciples are also included among the little ones. Those who welcome them will be rewarded.

Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor

It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement.

It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-HourChild Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at <u>www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis</u>. To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator Mary Beth Pacuska at 570-862-7551.
