Prayers for Ukraine

You may have noticed the addition of a table with a cross and candle located in the sanctuary near the papal flag. The purpose is to remind us that the people of Ukraine are still in need of our prayers as they are experiencing the cruelty of war. The table is draped in blue and yellow, the colors of the Ukrainian flag. The three-bared cross was used because it is the predominant cross of many eastern Catholic and eastern Orthodox churches, including the Ukrainian Catholic Church. The candle represents our prayers.



We will conduct another **Holy Hour for peace in Ukraine on Tuesday, June 14th at 5:00pm.** The holy hour will conclude with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament at 6:00pm.

Loving God, we pray for the people of Ukraine, for all those suffering or afraid, that you will be close to them and protect them. We pray for world leaders, for compassion, strength, and wisdom to guide their choices. We pray for the world that in this moment of crisis, we may reach out in solidarity to our brothers and sisters in need. May we walk in your ways so that peace and justice become a reality for the people of Ukraine and for all the world. Amen.

Liturgical Reflection ~ The Most Holy Trinity

FIRST READING: Proverbs 8:22-31

The word possessed, used in the first line of today's reading, describes the relationship between God and Lady Wisdom as God's coworker in the design and construction of creation. Wisdom is present with God before the creation of the world and plays a great part in helping to establish the order and beauty of all creation. Ultimately, Proverbs affirms that God's wisdom found great delight in the company of all creation, most especially the human race. The Spirit, understood as the wisdom of God, is the fullness and presence of God dwelling with all creation, delighting especially in the intimate relationship with all humanity.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: Psalm 8

Psalm 8 is a hymn that speaks about the glory that God has shared with human beings. When God created us, he breathed his Spirit into us. We are created in god's image and likeness. God shared His glory and honor with us and made us little less than angels. This carries a responsibility. We are created to be God's coworkers.



SECOND READING: Romans 5:1-5

Today's short second reading speaks of Paul's understanding of justification through faith in the Triune God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Our response in faith enables us to access God's peace and grace, leading us to boast only in God's glory. We boast both in good times and in bad, for, through faith, all things draw us near to God's love, which has been poured out into our hearts in and through the gift of the Spirit which has been giving to us. Such love is beyond our imagining and yet, is God's gift to all humanity freely, intimately, and completely. Jesus restored peace between God and humanity. Faith in Jesus gives us access to that peace and also to grace, that is, God's own life surging within us. So faith leads to peace and grace and they open the door to hope. United in Christ in faith we can hope to share in the glory of God.

WHEN HE, THE SPIRIT OF TRUTH, HAS COME, HE WILL GUIDE YOU INTO ALL TRUTH

GOSPEL: John 16:12-15

Taken from the Last Supper discourse, this text presents Jesus, as ever, trying to care for his disciples with careful explanations. Jesus speaks of his leave taking. He tells them that it will be the role of the Spirit to guide them to all truth. The disciples minds and hearts will be opened as the Spirit gives glory to Christ. It is the primary role of the Spirit to reveal Christ, who in turn is the fullness of truth because he mediates the Father to the world. The Spirit will guide and enlighten them on those things they currently find difficult to bear. All that the Father has given

to Jesus will be made clear and understandable through the Spirit that will be given to them. We are a community intimately untied to God through Christ by the work of the Spirit gifted to us. The Spirit will continue to declare such truth to the Church for all ages to come.

The Mystery of the Holy Trinity

The mystery of the Holy Trinity is the central mystery of the Christian faith and life. God reveals himself as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The doctrine of the Trinity includes three truths of faith.


First, the Trinity is One. We do not speak of three gods but of one God. Each of the Persons is fully God. They are a unity of Persons in one divine nature.

Second, the Divine Persons are distinct from each other. Father, Son, and Spirit are not three appearances or modes of God, but three identifiable persons, each fully God in a way distinct from the others. Third, the Divine Persons are in relation to each other.

The distinction of each is understood only in reference to the others. The Father cannot be the Father without the Son, nor can the Son be the Son without the Father. The Holy Spirit is related to the Father and the Son who both send him forth.

All Christians are baptized in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. The Trinity illumines all the other mysteries of faith.






