

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

Divine Mercy Sunday is celebrated on the Second Sunday of Easter. It is based on the private revelations of St. Faustina Kowalska, which recommended a particular devotion to the Divine Mercy. In 2000, St. Pope John Paul II canonized St. Faustina and, to ensure that the faithful would observe this day with intense devotion, he established that this Sunday be enriched by a plenary indulgence so that the faithful might receive in great abundance the gift of the consolation of the Holy Spirit.

Through a plenary indulgence, all temporal punishment due to sin is removed. To receive this indulgence, the following criteria must be met:

- The faithful must be in a state of grace at least at the time the indulgenced work is completed.
- The faithful must have the interior disposition of complete detachment from sin, even venial sin.
- Make a sacramental Confession.
- Receive Holy Communion
- In the presence of the Blessed Sacrament exposed or reserved in the tabernacle, recite the Our Father and the Creed, adding a devout prayer to the merciful Lord Jesus (such as, "Merciful Jesus, I trust in you!")



On **Sunday, April 7th**, we will celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday from 3:00pm-4:00pm in the church with the Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, praying the Divine Mercy Chaplet, confessions, and Benediction.

All members of the parish are invited and encouraged to participate in this special devotion.

Samaritan House Special Collection

There will be a special collection taken during both weekend Masses on **April 13 & 14** to benefit Samaritan House, which offers residence to people in the last stages of life. Care and comfort are provided by volunteers in cooperation with Hospice, and Samaritan House charges no fees. They are supported 100% by donations and fund-raising efforts.

Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor

It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement. It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-HourChild Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis . To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator Mary Beth Pacuska at 570-862-7551.

Baptism

<u>For infants/children</u>: Parents requesting Baptism for their child should make an appointment with the Pastor to begin the process.

<u>For adults</u>: The parish welcomes new members to the Church through a process called the Rite of Christian Initiation (RCIA). Contact the parish office for more information.



Confirmation

Confirmation is administered each spring to 8th grade students in our Parish Religious Education program. Children waiting to receive Confirmation must be enrolled and participating in the CCD program for two consecutive years before they are eligible to receive the sacrament.



Reconciliation

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is celebrated before weekday Mass at 11:45am and on Saturday at 4:30pm in the church. Confession can also be scheduled by appointment by calling the parish office.



Catholic Marriage

In order to complete the necessary paperwork, couples are asked to contact the parish office at least six months in advance of the proposed wedding date to begin the process by setting up an appointment with the pastor. The marriage cannot be scheduled until all necessary paperwork is completed.



Anointing of the Sick

Please notify the parish office if you or a loved one has become sick or hospitalized to make arrangements for a visit. Please note; because of government regulations regarding privacy, hospitals cannot release information without a patient's consent.

Qualifications for Godparents of Baptism and Confirmation Sponsors

In order for a person to be a Godparent for Baptism or a Sponsor for Confirmation, Canon Law (Church Law) identifies several qualifications for that person:

- Must be registered with a Catholic parish, attend Mass weekly, and receive the sacraments. Please not the
 pastor is not allowed to provide a sponsor card for persons who are not registered with the parish. Children
 are considered members with their parents until they turn 18 years old. Once they are 18, it is their own
 responsibility to attend church and to register as a member independent of their parents.
- 2. Cannot be the father or mother of the one being baptized or confirmed.
- 3. Must have received the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist.
- 4. If married, the marriage must be recognized as valid by the Catholic Church; couples who are not married may not be living together.
- 5. Those Catholics who have joined another religion may not act as a Godparent or Christian witness.
- 6. For Baptism, two sponsors are suggested, one of each gender, however only one sponsor is required. For Confirmation, only one sponsor is needed.

Effective May 1, 2024

On the recommendation of the Cemetery Committee at their meeting on March 13th, and due to inflation, Father Jacek approved the following price increase:

Full Size Grave Current price – \$275 New price as of May 1st - \$500

This new rate remains competitive for our area. In comparison, the price for a full size grave at the Wellsboro Cemetery is \$1000.

The current rate of \$275 will be honored through April 30, 2024.
