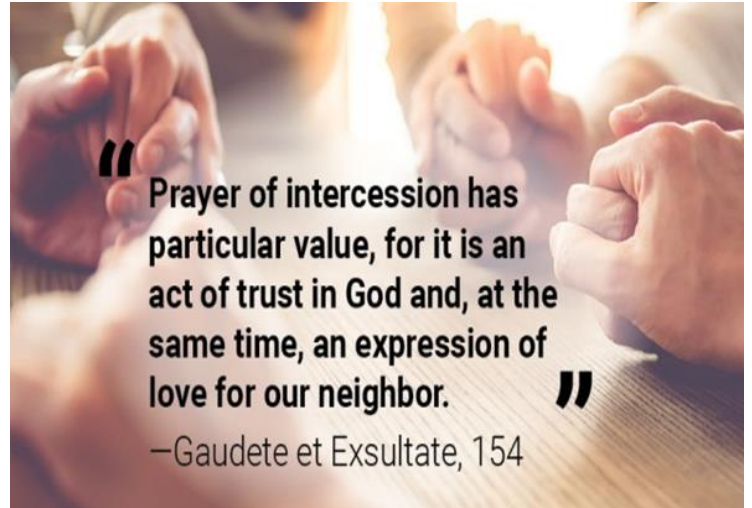

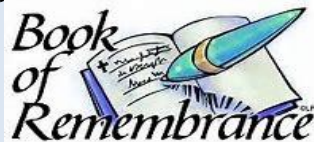
Parish News and Activities

Church Hours/Adoration

The church will be open for private prayer, Monday through Friday from 8:00am–5:00pm. From 8:00-9:00am, the only entrance will be through the door on the main parking lot side. From 9:00am-5:00pm, the front door and carport entrance will be open. If for some reason the main door is not unlocked, please enter through the parking lot door, as this entrance will always be open from 8:00am-5:00pm, Monday through Friday. Saturday, the church will be open from 8:00am–4:30pm using only the parking lot door. The front and carport doors will be unlocked at 4:15pm for those attending Mass. All doors of the church will be unlocked on Sunday morning at 8:00am for those attending Mass. Adoration will take place on Tuesday from 1:00pm-6:00pm, with Benediction but no evening prayer.

BOOK OF THE NAMES OF THE DEAD

The Church has a long tradition of remembering those who have died, to the love and mercy of God. We do this in a special way on the Feast of All Souls Day, and throughout November. During the month of November, a Book of the Names of the Dead will be located near the front entrance of the church. Liturgical Reflection ~ 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

FIRST READING: Malachi 3:19-20

Eschatology, the study of the end-times, is an important concern of the final weeks of the liturgical year. It is appropriate that as we approach the end of the year, we contemplate the end of time in order to remind ourselves that Christ will in fact return and no one will know when that day will be. Only God know how much time we actually have; therefore vigilance is a hallmark of Christian living. The prophet Malachi issues a dire warning about the end time. It will be a day of justice; the evildoers will be reduced to stubble by fire; but those who fear the name of the Lord will be saved. The words of the prophet have been addressed to the people of Israel, calling them out of their infidelity to the covenant with God.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: Psalm 98

Psalm 98 is hymn of praise for the Lord. It calls on the people to sing joyfully and play instruments. Even creation is to rejoice: the sea and the rivers are to clap their hands and the mountains should shout for joy. All this acclamation is due to the Lord, for he rules earth and its people with justice and equity.

SECOND READING: 2 Thessalonians 3:7-12

Paul reminds the Thessalonians of how he worked among them, without expecting pay for his labors. He holds this up to them as an example that they should imitate. Apparently, Paul did not want to be a burden on their resources, though it is likely that they showed him some form of hospitality. He takes issue with those who have been busybodies, acting in a disorderly fashion. This is not acceptable among those who should be doing the Lord's work.

GOSPEL: Luke 21:5-19

This passage from Luke is often referred to as an eschatological text; it points to the end times and includes cosmic signs and natural disasters that speak of the end of things known and familiar. Throughout his ministry, Jesus repeated that his Kingdom was not of this earth. Though he was concerned about the day to day life of his followers and for the kind of discipleship one had to embrace to enter God's Kingdom, Jesus never stopped directing focus to an eschatological future, whose advent even he was not privileged to know. Whenever the end may come, it is undeniable that each day draws us closer. Jesus is drawn into discussing the end after gazing on the Temple and anticipating its imminent demise. Such awareness is healthy and necessary for all mature believers. The positive message is that only God has a hand in the matters of life and death and those who persevere in faith will not be saved by the events of the world, but by God.

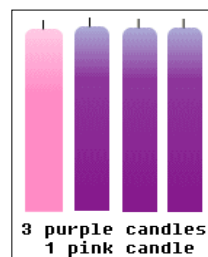
