Liturgical Reflection ~ 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

FIRST READING: Proverbs 31:10-13, 19-20, 30-31

This is the final Sunday before Christ the King. Throughout the Book of Proverbs there are instruction for young men on how to live a good and pleasing life. Today's reading is one of the few where the instructions are applied to woman. The woman's fear of the Lord is an example to us. Her works demonstrate how to respond faithfully to the Lord's call. Her reward for a life well lived is entrance in the heavenly Jerusalem. The poem speaks of outer beauty being fleeting, but the beauty of the soul is eternal.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: Psalm 128

The first step of living wisdom is fear of God. It does not mean that we are afraid that God will punish us, but that we recognize God's greatness and are willing to obey him wherever he may lead us. God is the only true guide for our lives. Those who fear the Lord are blessed. The verses used today begin and end with a general statement extending the Lord's blessing to all those who fear him.

SECOND READING: 1 Thessalonians 5:1-6

The early Church believed that Jesus would return in glory within a short time. When that didn't happen, they began to speak of it occurring unannounced, like a thief in the night. They would not know when, but they should always be ready. The timing of the Lord's coming will be unexpected. The Thessalonians are children of the light, not of the dark, so that even though they do not know when, they will not be left behind, as children of the light stay awake and live in the ways of the Lord.

GOSPEL: Matthew 25:14-30

Your talent is
Gods gift to you
What you do
with it
is your gift
back to God

The Gospel continues the wisdom theme with the well-known parable of the talents. It speaks of the fact that we have all received gifts from God and these gifts should be nurtured and used in the service of others. They have been given to us as gifts and should be shared as gifts. The parable is not about us earning our salvation, but rather about how responsible we are with all our generous gifts God gives us. We have to remember that all talents come from God. We could not succeed at anything if it were not for God's goodness. We must use our gifts to build up the Kingdom of God.



The table that was placed in the church to remember the people of Ukraine has been replaced with the statue of an angel. This statue was originally from Sacred Heart Church in Morris, PA, and will serve as a visual reminder to pray for peace and for all the innocent victims of war and conflict taking place around the world. Please remember them in your prayers.

Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor

It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement.

It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-HourChild Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis. To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator Mary Beth Pacuska at 570-862-7551.

Sunday, November 19th is our Annual Parish Family Advent Celebration






