Liturgical Reflection ~ 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time FIRST READING: Sirach 35:12-14, 16-18

The wisdom teacher Sirach declares that the Lord is a just God who shows no partiality to either the weak or their oppressors. Once again we hear that God's ways our not like our ways. While we tend to show partiality to those who are rich and powerful, God reaches out and embraces those who are weak and powerless. They are the chosen ones of God, for they recognize that they cannot survive without his intervention. God hears their prayers and responds to their needs.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: Psalm 34

The words of the refrain echo the tone of the reading from Sirach. The text is a hymn of praise of God; the actions of God, on behalf of those who cry, out are named. The saving action of the Lord is the reason "to bless the Lord at all times."

SECOND READING: 2 Timothy 4:6-8, 16-18

Today's reading invites each of us who are baptized to evaluate our commitment to Christ. If we were to die today, could we honestly say what Paul says to Timothy? Paul states that he is being poured out like a "libation," the drink offering that is poured at the end of some Jewish sacrificial rituals. The sacrifice that Paul offers is his life, which is drawing to a close. As he nears the end of his journey, Paul recalls his ministry and proclaims that the Lord will welcome him to the heavenly Kingdom. Paul never retired. He finished the race, the unique life-long mission that Christ gave him, which is both a testament to the commitment and energy he gave to his mission and a profession of faith in the Lord who has sustained him. But the glory, Paul states, belongs to the Lord. He concludes with confident hope that he will be rescued, not from physical danger, but for eternal life. And for that he sings Christ's praises!



GOSPEL: Luke 18:9-14

The parable of the Pharisee and the tax collector has overtones that are easily connected to the First Reading and the Responsorial Psalm. Luke tells us that Jesus addresses this parable to people who are goth self-righteous and enjoy looking down on everyone else. Both the prayer of the tax collector and the Pharisee are heard by God; the lesson of the parable lies in the disposition of the ones who pray. The honesty and sincerity of the former, and the lack of humility by the latter, set them apart. The fact that the Pharisee was a religious leader, and the tax collector a confessed sinner, is not lost on Jesus' listeners. What each of them confesses may be true; what's in their

hearts makes all the difference. The tax collector recognizes God's true role – to love every contrite heart, generously dispense mercy, and justify us in a way we could never merit on our own. The tax collector walks away from the temple justified in the only eyes that matter – God's. The Pharisee, who cultivates and cherishes an exalted opinion of his piety, does not.
