

Liturgical Reflection ~ 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

FIRST READING: Ezekiel 33:7-9

This reading from Ezekiel talks about the prophet's responsibility to give witness to what the Lord has told him. We are called to intervene if we see people who are in trouble by sinning against God. If we don't then we are responsible. But if we do intervene and are honest with them and yet they still continue with the sinful behavior and refuse to make changes, then the responsibility lies with them. But we must be careful to not be self-righteous when speaking, because our ability to see the truth and to give witness, comes from God as a gift, and not something that we have earned.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: Psalm 95

Today's Responsorial Psalm is a song of praise to the Lord and also a call to conversion. God is the "rock of our salvation" and "we are the people he shepherds." God asks us to hear his voice and not harden our heart or test or tempt God. When we sin, we reject God's voice and have turned our back on God's love, which is never ending. God is our shepherd and we must be willing to be obedient to him.

SECOND READING: Romans 13:8-10

In St. Paul's letter to the Romans, he shares Jesus' greatest commandment of all – "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." As Christians we have an obligation to each other. It is not enough to individually avoid doing sinful things to others, but we must also seek what is good for them. This great commandment is the fulfillment of the Law.

GOSPEL: Matthew 18:15-20



Today's Gospel speaks of how a community should conduct themselves. It talks of conflict between individuals and how to address it. The important part to note is that when we confront someone as instructed in this reading, we do not do so in a way that seeks revenge or to assert control over another person, but instead we do so for the good of the person. That last line of the reading shows the power of prayer and that when "two or three are gathered in my name," Jesus is in the midst of them.

Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor

It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement.

It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-HourChild Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at <u>www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis</u>. To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual wellbeing. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator Mary Beth Pacuska at 570-862-7551.



SCHEDULING 2024 MASS INTENTIONS

Scheduling Mass intentions for 2024 will be available beginning September 5th through the parish office, during regular business hours. **The following are the established guidelines for scheduling intentions:**

One weekend Mass on each weekend must be celebrated for the intentions of the parish. This is required by Canon Law (c. 534). Because of this, we only have one weekend Mass for which we can accept an intention. Due to this limited availability of weekend Masses, no family may schedule more than ONE WEEKEND MASS PER QUARTER, or four weekend Masses per year. There is no limit to the number of daily Mass intentions which may be scheduled by each family.

Canon 948 states, "Separate Masses are to be applied for the intentions of those for whom a single offering, although small, has been given and accepted." Therefore, only one intention may be scheduled for any given Mass. However, for pastoral concerns to better accommodate the needs of the parishioners, we will adhere to the following: Up to three first names with the same last name (i.e., John, Paul, and Mary Smith) or two last names only (i.e., Scott and Smith Families) will be allowed per intention.

The stipend given for a Mass intention is \$10. While we are willing to take requests over the phone, your Mass intention will not be scheduled until we are in receipt of your donation.

Christmas, Easter, Mother's Day, Father's Day, and All Souls Day Masses are always for the individual intentions listed by parishioners on their envelope.

The Sanctuary Candle, burning in memory or in honor of someone, is available on a weekly basis with no limit to the number each family may reserve. The stipend given for the Sanctuary Candle is \$10.


Volunteer Opportunity Collection Counter
