

Liturgical Reflection ~ 24th Sunday in Ordinary Time

FIRST READING: Exodus 32:7-11, 13-14

The narrator of Exodus reports a dramatic conversation between God and Moses that takes place on top of the covenant mountain while down below the Israelites pray and offer sacrifices to the work of their hands. God is displeased with the infidelity of the "stiff-necked" people and intends to bring punishment upon them as the people seemed to be determined to go their own way rather than follow the Lord. God sends Moses to make such an announcement. But Moses implores God to remember that they are "your own people" and reminds God of the promise to make this people a great nation. God listens to Moses and relents.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: Psalm 51


Psalm 51 is a penitential psalm written to commemorate the day that David repented for his sin against God and against Uriah the Hittite. The psalm reminds us that we cannot obtain forgiveness of sin by ourselves. The only way we can find forgiveness is to have a humble, contrite heart, for it is God who will renew us.

SECOND READING: 1 Timothy 1:12-17

This letter portrays Paul the great evangelist as Paul the great sinner. Paul's biographical account to Timothy recalls his time of persecution of the followers of Christ. But Paul gives thanks to the Lord for sending him the grace to change his life. Because Paul acted out of ignorance in his unbelief, Christ treated him mercifully. He now believes that Christ came into the world to save sinners and he humbly counts himself as one of them. He then expresses gratitude that Christ Jesus considered him a trustworthy Apostle.

GOSPEL: Luke 15:1-32

Chapter 15 of Luke's account recounts three of the most familiar parables of Jesus. The lost sheep, the lost coin, and the Prodigal Son attest to the mercy of God and explain Jesus' actions to the religious leaders. Each notes the joy of the shepherd, the woman, and the father when the sheep, the coin, and the son have been found. The compassion of God is personified in the actions of the shepherd, the woman, and the father who seek out the lost. The story of the prodigal centers on the Father's mercy and reminds us we can always return home. To his older son, the father responds: "My son, you are here with me always, everything I have is yours." The older son, like all disciples,



enjoys an indescribably rich daily life in his father's house. And the return to life and to that father's house of one who is lost and dead cannot go uncelebrated. All are offered forgiveness; not all embrace it.


Book Group


What is a Living Rosary? The devotion appears to have begun in France in 1826 when Venerable Pauline-Marie Jaricot formed the Living Rosary Association. She was inspired to pull together groups of 15 persons who would each be responsible for praying one decade of the Rosary each day so that the full 15-decades Rosary would be prayed each day by the group.

With 20 decades to cover now, we need at least that many participants. For those who struggle with the Rosary, the Living Rosary is a beautiful way to participate in one of the most powerful prayers of the Church - praying the same mystery every day and dedicating it to a specific intention. Adult Volunteer Opportunities

Children and teens, ages preschool through 12th grade, attend St. Peter's Religious Education Program to celebrate the sacraments and learn about the Catholic faith. If you are interested in joining this important ministry, please prayerfully consider volunteering for the following available positions:

Catechist Assistant - The role of an assistant is to attend class each week to help where needed, serve as a support to the lead catechist by assisting students with the lesson and activities, and to help maintain a safe atmosphere for learning in the classroom.

Children's Liturgy of the Word Leader - During the 8:30am Mass, children in grades K-3 are called forward before the Scripture readings begin and are sent to the Parish Center with an adult leader. There they will hear the same readings that are proclaimed at Mass, but explained on a level that younger children can understand. Volunteers are needed to lead Children's Liturgy and all materials are provided in advance. Depending on the number of volunteers, leaders can expect to be scheduled approximately once every 4-6 weeks.
