#### Liturgical Reflection ~ 23<sup>rd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time FIRST READING: Wisdom 9:13-18


This passage is part of a beautiful prayer. The king asks the Creator to give him wisdom to rule with holiness and righteousness and to judge the people fairly. The theme of today's First Reading and Gospel is that God's ways are far beyond our ways. The author of the Book of Wisdom begs the question: Who can know the wisdom of God? Mortal beings are timid and unsure as they search for what God intends. But the wisdom of God is imparted through the Holy Spirit. Those who receive this wisdom will stand in awe of God's wonder and providence and their path of life will be made straight.

### **RESPONSORIAL PSALM: Psalm 90**

The Responsorial Psalm continues the theme of the wisdom of God and how his ways are far beyond our understanding. The psalm reminds us to open our hearts to the ways of the Lord and not get so caught up in our everyday lives that we forget to explore its spiritual dimension.

#### SECOND READING: Philemon 9-10, 12-17

Paul writes to Philemon asking him to accept Onesimus, a runaway slave whom Paul has met and converted to Christianity, and to continue the work of the Gospel. Paul shows concern that the Philemon's treatment of Onesimus is that of a person of equal status because of their relationship with Christ. Paul preaches that baptism removes the distinctions that society insists on making. He urges Christians to live by Christ's standards. Paul writes from prison but accepts his situation because it is in the name of Jesus Christ and for the sake of the Gospel. Paul is committed to doing what he can to continue the work of the Gospel through Philemon and Onesimus.



### GOSPEL: Luke 14:25-33

As Jesus journeys on to Jerusalem, he teaches to the crowds that are traveling with him about the difficult demands of being his disciples. This may have been one of the "hard sayings" that caused some to walk away from his mission. Jesus teaches that in order to follow him, one must leave all other claims on their time and energy. Even family obligations have to be reconsidered by those who choose to follow him. Following Christ not only requires placing him ahead of all other values and concerns, but it also demands a willingness to carry our cross and suffer with him. It will sooner or later cost us all that we have, but we will acquire more than we ever hoped to receive.


#### **Book Group**

With 20 decades to cover now, we need at least that many participants. For those who struggle with the Rosary, the Living Rosary is a beautiful way to participate in one of the most powerful prayers of the Church - praying the same mystery every day and dedicating it to a specific intention. 

**Register Now** - Registration information has been mailed to all returning students. Please fill out the registration form and return by September 8th. If you have a new student or did not receive the mailing, please call or email the Religious Education office and information will be mailed to you.

#### **Adult Volunteer Opportunities**

Children and teens, ages preschool through 12th grade, attend St. Peter's Religious Education Program to celebrate the sacraments and learn about the Catholic faith. If you are interested in joining this important ministry, please prayerfully consider volunteering for the following available positions:

**Catechist Assistant** - The role of an assistant is to attend class each week to help where needed, serve as a support to the lead catechist by assisting students with the lesson and activities, and to help maintain a safe atmosphere for learning in the classroom.

**Children's Liturgy of the Word Leader** - During the 8:30am Mass, children in grades K-3 are called forward before the Scripture readings begin and are sent to the Parish Center with an adult leader. There they will hear the same readings that are proclaimed at Mass, but explained on a level that younger children can understand. Volunteers are needed to lead Children's Liturgy and all materials are provided in advance. Depending on the number of volunteers, leaders can expect to be scheduled approximately once every 4-6 weeks.

St. Peter's in blessed to have an active group of parishioners who support our faith formation programs by volunteering their time and talents. Our religious education program would not be possible without them. # **SCHEDULING 2023 MASS INTENTIONS**

Scheduling Mass intentions for 2023 is now open through the parish office, during regular business hours. **The following are the established guidelines for scheduling intentions:** 

- One weekend Mass on each weekend must be celebrated for the intentions of the parish, which is required by Canon Law (c. 534). Because of this we only have one weekend Mass for which we can accept an intention. Due to this limited availability of weekend Masses, no family may schedule more than ONE WEEKEND MASS PER QUARTER, or four weekend Masses per year.
- There is no limit to the number of DAILY MASS INTENTIONS, including those Masses said at the nursing homes each month, which may be scheduled by each family.
- Canon 948 states, "Separate Masses are to be applied for the intentions of those for whom a single offering, although small, has been given and accepted." Therefore, only one intention may be scheduled for any given Mass. However, for pastoral concerns to better accommodate the needs of the parishioners, we will adhere to the following: Up to three first names with the same last name (i.e., John, Paul, and Mary Smith) or two last names only (i.e., Scott and Smith Families) will be allowed per intention.
- The stipend given for a Mass intention is \$10. While we are willing to take requests over the phone, your Mass Intention will be not be scheduled until we are in receipt of your donation.
- Christmas, Easter, Mother's Day, Father's Day, and All Souls Day Masses are always for the individual intentions listed by parishioners on their envelope.
- The Sanctuary Candle, burning in memory or honor of someone, is available on a weekly basis with no limit to the number each family may reserve.
