



Liturgical Reflection ~ 28th Sunday in Ordinary Time



GOSPEL: Matthew 22:1-14

Today's parable centers on whom God invites to the banquet of the Kingdom of Heaven. Many of those whom God has invited have refused the invitation and lose their opportunity to share in his heavenly banquet. Twice we hear the invitation being ignored. Finally the servants bring in all the people they could find – the good and the bad – but all were expected that they make themselves ready. The guest who was not dressed well represents those who are invited but refused to change their ways. The guest responded to God's invitation, but did not continue to live a Christian life. The final verse summarizes the meaning of his parable – "Many are invited, but few are chosen". While we would never reject God completely, it is likely that we have at times not fully answered God's call. Are we making excuses or are we striving to fully accept God's invitation?

Parking Lot Paving Project Notice



Over the next few weeks, the lower parking lots will be repaved. The project is expected to take around two weeks, and we expect to have access to the church during this time. We are coordinating this project and sharing the cost with UPMC Susquehanna. St. Peter's will be responsible for just under 30% of the cost, and our share is expected to be approximately \$27,000. Contributions to defray the costs may be made using your Building Funds envelope, or by otherwise noting on your offering. We appreciate your generosity and patience during this time, and we will provide additional information as it become available.

Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor

It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement.

It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-HourChild Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis. To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator Mary Beth Pacuska at 570-862-7551.

Marian Ministries Afternoon of Reflection "In the Breaking of the Bread" with Mary Clare Hallman







The following maintenance and purchases have recently taken place:


- Light bulbs have been replaced in all the church parking lot lights.
